Amanohashidate, famed as one of the three most scenic in Japan, is a sandbank imbued with natural mystery that stretches about 3.6 km between Miyazu Bay and the Aso Sea. Approximately 8,000 Japanese black pine trees covers the sandbank.

This sandbank, when viewed matanozoki-style (Upside down looking though your legs) from the Amanohashidate View Land platforms, appears as a dragon ascending to the heavens. It is this view that gave the Hiryukan its name, view of the skyward dragon.

The emerald landscape traversing through the blue ocean and sky never fails to attract visitors.

Amanohashidate Viewland is an amusement park with an observation point to enjoy the view.
